Exposures Outside the Atlanta Area

If exposure occurs outside the Atlanta area, it is recommended that the student seek medical care from the nearest emergency room or health care facility.

- If health care providers at the facility have questions about appropriate care, they can call the national HIV Post-Exposure Prophylaxis (PEP) Hotline for Clinicians at 1-888-HIV-4911, which is open 24 hours per day.
- Students should contact the AUCC-SHWC on the next (non-holiday) weekday following the exposure at shwcrequests@msm.edu.

Incident Reports. Regardless of location, students must complete a needlestick incident report on the day in which the incident occurred. The report will include information identifying the source of exposure and how to follow up. Bring a copy of the incident report to AUCC-SHWC.

- Cost. If the above protocol is followed, AUCC-SHWC will submit a medical insurance claim for the following labs: HIV, HBsAb, HBsAg, HBcAb, and Hepatitis C Ab.
